The New York Times bestselling author of Those Who Save Us creates a vivid portrait of marriage, family, and the haunting grief of World War II in her third novel, The Lost Family, an emotionally charged, beautifully rendered story that spans generations. Jenna Blum artfully brings to the page a husband devastated by a grief he cannot name, a frustrated wife struggling to compete with a ghost she cannot banish, and a daughter sensitive to the pain of both her own family and another lost before she was born. Blum's debut novel, Those Who Saved Us, was the winner of the 2005 Ribalow Prize and a perennial book club favorite. Her second novel, The Stormchasers, followed to critical acclaim. 




Unconditional Love:

After 20 years, Pulitzer Prize finalist Nathan Englander returns to Rochester with his latest novel, *Dinner at the Center of the Earth*—a political thriller that unfolds in the highly charged territory of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and pivots on the complex relationship between a secret prisoner and his guard. Who is right, who is wrong—who is the guard, who is truly the prisoner? This novel is a tour de force from one of America's most acclaimed voices in contemporary fiction. Englander is the author of the novel *The Ministry of Special Cases*, and the story collections *For the Relief of Unbearable Urges* and *What We Talk About When We Talk About Anne Frank*, a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize. Englander's play, *The Twenty-Seventh Man*, premiered at The Public Theater in 2012. He is Distinguished Writer-in-Residence at New York University and lives in Brooklyn, N.Y. with his family.



The Attachment Effect: Exploring the Powerful Ways Our Earliest Bond Shapes Our Relationships and Lives (TarcherPerigee, 2018)




JOANNE SERLING Good Neighbors (Twelve, 2018)


