Hiding deep within the forests of Eastern Europe, battling against extraordinary odds, more than 25,000 Jewish partisans blew up trains, burned electric stations, attacked enemy headquarters, and sabotaged the Nazi war machine whenever and however they could. This important documentary features surviving partisans who tell their stories through interviews, family photographs, and rare archival footage. In Tablet, Marjorie Ingall calls it, "Surprising, moving...and sometimes shockingly funny." Four Winters is a stunning, heartfelt narrative of heroism, resilience, and resistance, celebrating the courage, cleverness, and leadership of the partisans.

In 2021, Israel's baseball team competed in the Olympics for the very first time. With no media allowed in Tokyo's Olympic Village because of Covid restrictions, the players record their own experiences. Mostly newly minted Israelis, they log unexpected battles against anti-Semitism and anti-Zionism. Victory for Israel comes on the playing field, though not on the podium. Israel Swings for Gold follows the 2018 hit Heading Home: The Tale of Team Israel, about Israel's Cinderella run at the 2017 World Baseball Classic which played at our festival in 2018.

Filmed in a single remarkable shot, SHTTL presents a day in the life of a Jewish village before it disappears. SHTTL depicts the vitality and vibrancy of lives about to be destroyed. The set was to be turned into a museum but has since been destroyed in the ongoing war in Ukraine.



Produced by Nancy Spielberg, Closed Circuit is unlike anything you've ever seen. It consists of footage recorded by hidden security cameras installed throughout Tel Aviv's Sarona Market, which was attacked by terrorists in 2016, and includes riveting interviews with both Jewish and Muslim witnesses to the event. They include a customer who fought back, a cop who unknowingly saved one of the fleeing terrorists, restaurant workers, and a man celebrating the end of the Ramadan fast with his family. Their words quietly but powerfully reveal how every would-be act of terror can have complex, unexpected consequences.



Three Israeli Films, Three Unique Stories

Sunday, August 6, 1pm; Dryden Theatre Cinema Sabaya

Narrative | 2022 | 92 min. Hebrew, Arabic (w/ subtitles) Israel, Belgium | Director: Orit Fouks Rotem



At a workshop, a group of Arab and Jewish women learn to document their lives on video. As the women share their raw footage, they are forced to challenge preconceived beliefs. Writer-director Orit Fouks Rotem's dramatic narrative feels utterly real because it is based closely on her own teaching experiences and features a mix of seasoned and non-professional actors.
