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

Bev Bauman (Stage Manager) has served as the stage manager for a multitude of productions around Rochester and is grateful to be working on her first show as the stage manager at the JCC, joining the ranks of the other amazing stage managers of CenterStage. Other notable credits in Rochester include: working with Blackfriars Theatre as assistant director of Wickhams: Christmas at Pemberley and stage manager of: Cabaret, Once On This Island, Imagination Station with Mrs. Kasha Davis, Too Much Light Makes the Baby Go Blind, and Next to Normal: stage manager of Finger Lake Opera's Gianni Schicchi, and assistant stage manager for Finger Lake Opera's 2021, 2022, and 2023 Tomika Young Artists Program and their 2023 production of Aida. In addition to her theatre work, Bev spends her days educating young minds as an early childhood educator at the Children's Center of Brighton.

Kristen MacKay (Costume Designer)

was active in community theatre as a costume designer and stage manager in the Finger Lakes for many years, with credits including Guys & Dolls (2013), The Wedding Singer (2009), and The Wild Party (2006). Arts, and the JCC. . **Bob Puff (Sound Designer)** is founder and president of New Life Electronics, located in Rochester, providing sound services and rental throughout New York State for over 25 years. JCC credits include every year of the Hitmakers series, Into the Woods, Ain't Misbehavin', Bring it On, First Date, Titanic, The Bridges of Madison County, Oklahoma!, Little Shop of Horrors, Rise, The Pirates of Penzance, Ragtime, Beautful, and A Chorus Line.

Emily Desousa (Rehearsal

Accompanist) is a collaborative pianist and vocalist originally from Syracuse, NY. She moved to Rochester in 2017 to attend Nazareth University where she was a member of the Women's Choir, pianist in the Chamber Players Ensemble, and violist in the Nazareth Symphony Orchestra. Emily has vocal directed and accompanied for local organizations such as Lyric Voices, Rochester Musical Theater Academy, The Genesee Valley Orchestra & Choir, Pittsford Musicals, TYKEs and CenterStage. She is also a pit member and conducts pit orchestras around the Rochester and Syracuse areas. During the day, Emily accompanies for Pittsford Schools choral programs and in her free time, she enjoys being a photographer, exploring new restaurants, and spending lots of time with her animals!

Ralph Meranto (CenterStage Artistic

Director) is Artistic Director of JCC CenterStage. His passion for new work has led to the developed of multiple plays including recent productions of Tracy Jones by Stephen Kaplan, Division Street and On the Market (both by Jason Odell Williams), RuPaul's Drag Race star Mrs. Kasha Davis' There's Always Time for a Cocktail (Off-Broadway Premiere Beechman Theater), Bruce Sabbath's Searching for Tevye and the annual popular music series: Hitmakers. Perhaps his favorite project was directing and collaborating with Jason on the world premiere of Church & State and co-producing its Off-Broadway run (OBA Best New Play Nominee).

Andrew Lloyd Webber (Composer) has

composed the scores of some of the world's most famous musicals. From Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat (1969) to Cinderella (2021), his work has been consistently seen on world stages. Before the COVID pandemic hit, Lloyd Webber had shows continually running in the West End for 48 years and on Broadway for 41. When Sunset Boulevard joined School Of Rock, CATS and The Phantom Of the Opera, he equalled Rodgers & Hammerstein's record of four shows running simultaneously on Broadway. He is one of the select group of artists with EGOT status, having received Emmy, Grammy, Oscar and Tony Awards.

Llovd Webber owns seven London theatres, including the iconic London Palladium and Theatre Royal, Drury Lane. Over the past three years the latter has been completely restored and renovated at a cost of over £60 million. It is one of the biggest projects ever undertaken by a private theatre owner in recent times. His mantra that every penny of profit made from his theatres is ploughed back into the buildings has meant that considerable work has been undertaken across his theatre portfolio during the pandemic, including the complete remodelling and reseating of the Gillian Lynne.

Lloyd Webber is passionate about the importance of musical education and diversity in the arts. The Andrew Lloyd Webber Foundation provides 30 performing arts scholarships every year for talented students with financial need and supports a range of projects such as the Music In Secondary School Trust and commissioning research into diversity in theatre.
