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

Ralph Meranto (Director, Producer) is Artistic Director of JCC CenterStage and Chief Creative Officer of the JCC. His passion for new work has led to the developed of multiple plays including recent productions of *Tracy Jones* by Stephen Kaplan, *Division Street* and *On the Market* (both by Jason Odell Williams), *RuPaul's Drag Race* star Mrs. Kasha Davis' *There's Always Time for a Cocktail* (Off-Broadway Premiere Beechman Theater), Bruce Sabbath's Searching for Tevye

and the annual popular music series: *Hitmakers*. Perhaps his favorite project was directing and collaborating with Jason on the world premiere of *Church & State* and co-producing its Off-Broadway run (OBA Best New Play Nominee).

Jamey Leverett (Choreographer) received her principal training at the Draper Center for Dance Education under the guidance of founder Timothy M. Draper. As a former dancer with Rochester City Ballet (RCB), she performed leading roles in The Nutcracker and originated the title role in The Firebird, choreographed especially for her. Early in her career, she began choreographing for RCB, with signature works like Inner Voices and Gershwin in the Park still a celebrated part of the company's history. In November 2003, Ms. Leverett succeeded founding Artistic Director Timothy M. Draper and led the transformation of Rochester City Ballet from a student company into a fully professional troupe performing masterworks and world premieres. She brought a bold, collaborative perspective and a commitment to technical excellence to her leadership. Under her direction, RCB experienced tremendous growth: the company expanded from four to nineteen contracted dancers, its home season grew to include multiple performances at the Nazareth College Arts Center and Kodak Hall at Eastman Theatre, and RCB made its New York City debut in July 2010. Her choreography has been showcased nationally and internationally, including selections for New York City's "Ballet Builders, New Choreographers on Pointe," the Jackson International Ballet Competition, and Italy's Festival dei Due Mondi. Ms. Leverett is a multiple-time recipient of the Outstanding Choreographer and Outstanding Teacher awards at Youth America Grand Prix, the world's largest ballet scholarship competition. Today, Ms. Leverett is fully dedicated to her role as Artistic Director of Draper Center for Dance Education, where she continues to shape and inspire the next generation of dancers. Under her leadership, Draper Center students have earned scholarships to prestigious university dance programs across the United States and have gone on to successful professional careers in ballet companies, contemporary companies, and musical theater. Passionate about dance education and the transformative power of the arts, Ms. Leverett remains committed to fostering both artistic excellence and personal growth in every student she teaches. Her favorite place continues to be in the studio, sharing her deep love of dance with the young artists she mentors.




